“Medicine for the Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Patient and You: A Topic Based Discussion”

Recent advances in the medical management of patients have changed the medical “make-up” of oral surgical patients and the surgeons who treat them. Surgeons have an obligation to their patients and themselves to be current on the effects of medical disease, and the pharmaceuticals used to treat these diseases and their impact on the surgical patient.

This program provides an overview of the medical conditions that oral surgeons are most likely to encounter in themselves and their practice. The format is case based, with examples of patients presenting for surgical treatment and an opportunity for attendees to participate in the formulation of treatment plans that will provide the safe rendering of oral surgical care.

After each case scenario, the seminar will be turned over to a panel of medical and anesthesia specialists who will review the disease process, discuss current advances in its treatment, and make suggestions for the treatment of surgical patients with this disease process. Dr. Betts will then review the case, provide treatment recommendations and discuss the management of potential medical complications of surgical treatment.

Course Educational Objectives

- Update medical knowledge in areas common to patients presenting for surgical treatment, and the attendees of the meeting.
- Improve the oral surgeon’s ability to manage the medically compromised patient.
- Discuss pharmaceuticals used to treat medical patients (including the attendees of the meeting) and their impact upon these patients, centering on their effects on surgical treatment.
- Present strategies to prevent the occurrence of medical emergencies.

Norman J. Betts, DDS, MS is an Adjunct Associate Professor in the Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and Hospital Dentistry at the University of Michigan, School of Dentistry. He has an active private practice in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery in Plymouth and Ann Arbor, Michigan. His current hospital appointment is at the St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Ann Arbor, Michigan. He has lectured for many years at the University of Michigan, School of Dentistry and the Washtenaw Community College Dental Assisting Program. Dr. Betts is a Fellow of the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons and a Diplomate of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons.

James D. Ruskin, DMD, MD, FACS is a Professor in the Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and Diagnostic Sciences at the University of Florida College of Dentistry. Dr. Ruskin is a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons, the American College of Dentists and the International College of Dentists and a Diplomate of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. He is actively involved in research in the areas of guided bone regeneration and dental implants in compromised patient populations.
